



Innovation for Development: Service Mapping

Step 1: Empathize and Define (30 minutes)

- Select an issue
- Define a target (rural farmer, unemployed young single mother living in the city, disabled worker, etc.)
- Map out a day in the life (focusing on "pain points")

Step 2: Ideate (30 minutes)

 Identify potential innovative <u>media</u> responses to these "pain points"

Step 3: Report back to the Group (20 minutes)

- Some teams will report back to the group their ideas
- Will start Session #4 with group reports...
